


- o Identify and acknowledge our current circumstances,

Tuesday, February 7, 7 pm: A History of the World in 100 Objects by Neil MacGregor

This book was published as a companion to a joint project of BBC Radio 4 and British Museum, which was broadcast over a 20-week period beginning on Jan 18, 2010. Comprised of 100 fifteen-minute presentations, the British Museum's director, Neil MacGregor, "used objects of ancient art, industry, technology and arms as an introduction to parts of human history". The book has been on the New York Times paperback bestseller list and has been described as "clever and warm"; "witty, endearing and greatly entertaining"; and a "laugh-out-loud whodunit."

In response, the board has authorized a new steering committee to take an open-minded look at the possibilities the future might hold for us and

to examine these options in regards to effort, costs, time frame, interest, and feasibility.

The members of this steering committee are Linda Steiner, Tom Bularzik, Don Swanson, Kathy Pearce, George Goss, and Michael Domina. If anyone has thoughts they want us to consider or questions as we go along, please let any of us know.

We were all excited to have our first meeting last week and to begin our extensive research. We look forward to presenting our findings as we get further along in the process.

## Board of Trustees



Over this past month, the Board has been busy with multiple issues. Ongoing topics dealt with at our last meeting are completing the banner and working on repairing the Wayside pulpit which are in progress.

As part of the efforts to research and consider future directions, the Board was joined by Rev. Jim Robinson who was instrumental in the formation of the 5 Points cluster of UU churches on the South Shore. He explained the process of forming and some of the ongoing work of this collaboration of churches. In order to explore this further, several All Souls members attended the Cluster's most recent meeting on January 21.

A Future Planning Steering Committee has been formed to help consider and guide recommendations. Members are Tom Bularzik, Kathy Pearce, Don Swanson, George Goss, Michael Domina and Linda Steiner who will serve as a Board liaison. See below for more information.

A Spring Event has been set for April 16 at All Souls. It will consist of an afternoon lecture for the community by Faries Gray, sagamore (chief) of the Massachusetts Tribe of the Ponkapoag followed by a reception.

The Board also met on Friday, Jan 13 to consider 2 other issues. A request to rent the Parish Hall on a Sunday in March sparked a discussion on updating the

present rental agreement. It was decided that an increase in rental fees was warranted and approved. There was also discussion regarding policies about use of church equipment and a policy about alcohol use. It was decided that renters would need to bring their own audio equipment. Alcohol use remains at the discretion of the Board and, if approved, would require that a professional bartender be hired by the renter.

Also discussed was the state of parking lot access. It was decided that Magic Years would be approached about ensuring that flags and cones are removed by them after their sessions to allow full access to parking spaces for church events and renters.


